## Sioux Falls Challenge Cup Competition 2024

The competition is conducted in accordance with the guidelines in the most current ISI Handbook. Events are offered to all ages - Tots through Adults and will include the following events:

Tots 1, 2, 3, 4 Solo Comp<br>Pre Alpha - Delta Program Footwork<br>Team Compulsory<br>Jump \& spin Rhythmic<br>Family Spotlight<br>Freestyle 1-10<br>Production Team<br>Theater Production Team<br>Hockey Goalie<br>Hockey Shooting<br>Hockey Skating<br>Interpretive<br>Team Surprise Stroking

All skaters must be current ISI members. Skaters will be grouped by age and test level as of February 5th, 2024. Whenever possible, there will be divisions for male and female skaters. All skaters in Tot - Delta events will receive an award. Freestyle skaters will receive awards for 1st - 5th place. We reserve the right to limit the number of entries on a first come, first serve basis.

EntryEeze deadline is February 5th, 2024. Late entries will include a $\$ 25$ late fee.
EntryEeze will be used for competition entries and for digital music upload. Music upload deadline is February 24, 2024.

Paper entries will be accepted but each paper form will need to include a $\$ 10$ processing fee (per skater or per team). Paper entries must be postmarked no later than February 5th, 2024.

## RULES

The most current rules will be in effect for the SF Challenge Cup. All Rule Revisions are listed on the ISI website at www.skateisi.com. The ISI Handbook can be purchased online.

## VERIFICATION \& POLICY FOR PAPER REGISTRATION FORMS

If submitting registrations by mail: A $\mathbf{\$ 1 0 . 0 0}$ processing fee must accompany all paper registrations submitted per individual and per each team registration.
The skating professional and Team Liaison must both sign the entry form to verify that the information on the form is correct and true. The information on the entry form must be accurate, complete, signed and mailed by the Team Liaison. Inaccurate and/or incomplete forms will be returned. Skaters must have an ISI number and the number and expiration date must be listed on the entry form. If the skater has applied for an ISI number and has not yet received it, write "applied for" in the space that requires the skater's ISI number. All forms must be signed by a current ISI Professional Member. Coaches must provide an accurate email address on the EntryEeze site if they wish to receive competition information at that address. Any false information provided will result in disqualification. All entries are verified with ISI Headquarters for current membership status and test level.

## MUSIC, CHECK-IN and REGISTRATION INFORMATION

All music should be uploaded to EntryEeze prior to February 24, 2024. Registration desk will not be taking CDs but skaters should have a backup copy on CD with them rink side. If uploaded after February 24th, there will be a $\$ 25.00$ late fee to upload music. There will be a $\$ 25.00$ fee to change any music after February $24,2024$.

All competitors must register no later than 60 minutes prior to the scheduled program event. We reserve the right to hold events up to 30 minutes prior to their scheduled time. Subject to changes due to covid-19 guidelines at the time of the event.

## Practice Ice

Practice ice times will be determined after the final schedule is released and will be available for purchase through an Entry Eeze Link to all competitors. All practice ice will be sold on a first come, first serve basis, with a limit of 20 skaters per session.

## ISI JUDGES

- All judges must be certified at one of the following levels: Bronze, Silver, Gold or Synchro.
- All judges must also have passed the most current ISI judge's 2022 update test
- All coaches must be current professional members
- No individual will be allowed to judge an event where a relative is a participant.
- An individual may not be a competitor and judge in the same competition.
- Each team must follow the participation guidelines or the skaters may not compete.
- Must have a valid 2023-2024 District 10 credential

Coaches/Judges Credentials: Per District 10 Policy only credentialed coaches with a valid event credential will be allowed in the skater ready area and be allowed to put skaters on the ice for their events. No parents, skaters or anyone without a valid credential will be allowed in the skater ready area.

## ELIGIBILITY

Events are offered to all ages - Tots through Adults. All skaters entering the competition must be individual members of ISI. All skaters must compete at the highest ISI level passed. All tests must be registered with the ISI national office prior to February 5th, 2024. Members of USFS, who are individual members and have registered tests with ISI, are eligible to compete in accordance with the ISI-USFS joint statements of policy:

USFS Moves-in-the-Field test levels have no bearing on ISI test levels or competition level.

## INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

All routines must start from a stationary position. The timing will start when any motion from the skater's starting position is initiated. There will be a 10 -second leeway on all programs with set duration times. Timing will stop when the skater stops moving completely.Judging will stop at 10 seconds over the prescribed time.

## TOT 1-4 PROGRAM

Skaters are to perform a program to music, including all of the required compulsory maneuvers from the test level. If necessary, coaches may accompany young skaters onto the ice during tot events. Additional maneuvers are not to be included. Two-foot or one-foot snowplow are permitted in these events. Duration: 1 minute

## PRE-ALPHA - DELTA PROGRAM

Skaters will execute all required compulsory moves in a program with music. All skaters in Pre-Alpha through Delta must add one additional maneuver from Freestyle 1 to their program. In Delta, the skater has a "Choice-of-One"
maneuver listed in the manual. This means that only one maneuver should be performed. In case of misinterpretation of "Choice-of-One", the performance of the first maneuver will be judged. Duration: 1 minute

## FREESTYLE 1-10 PROGRAM

All skaters in Freestyle 1-10 are not permitted to perform any additional maneuvers from higher test levels. In Freestyle 3, 6, 7 and 8 certain maneuvers are listed under "Choice-of-One". This means only one of the maneuvers may be performed. If more than one is performed, only the first maneuver will be judged.

## OPEN FREESTYLE

Skaters can participate in both Open Freestyle and Freestyle 1-10. In Open Freestyle there are no required maneuvers, but skaters are limited to the jump elements listed below. Skaters can perform any spin at any level. The lllusion is now an uncaptured move and may be performed at the Freestyle 4/Open Silver level or higher.

## STROKING PRE-ALPHA - FREESTYLE 3

Skaters will perform forward stroking in both directions to music selected by the host rink. Judging Criteria will be: Cleanliness of Edges, Rhythm, Endurance, Posture, Flexible Skating Knee, Flow, Proper Push-offs (no toe picks) and Extension of Free Leg.

## *Beginning Sept. 1st, 2022, in all stroking events, forward crossovers are required on the end patterns and will be judged. <br> *Coaches may not help skater during the actual event.

## SPECIAL SKATER 1-10

This category is open to skaters of all ages with physical or mental disabilities. Skaters will perform a program to music for 1 minute that includes all of the compulsory maneuvers from their test level. Skaters will be grouped by age, gender, and disability classification. The Special Skater event is based on the ISI Special Skater test levels 1-10. These tests must be registered with the ISI national office.
Above the Special Skater 10 (Delta) level, Special Skaters can take and pass the test levels in Freestyle, Figures,
Couples, Pairs, Dance and Free Dance so they are eligible to compete in those events - along with Artistic,
Footwork, Interpretive, etc. If requested, the Competition Director can put special skaters into a separate event group for those events.

## SOLO COMPULSORY

There will be no music for Compulsories. For each level, the skater will perform only the 3 maneuvers listed below. Each maneuver may be performed or attempted only once. Additional maneuvers, such as any jump, spin or gliding maneuvers from any test level or any uncaptured moves are not allowed. Any penalties such as the 2.0 score for attempting illegal maneuvers will be assessed by Judge 1.

## Pre Alpha - Freestyle 4 will use $1 / 2$ sheet of ice.

Alpha: Forward Stroking, Right over Left Forward Crossovers, 1-Foot Snowplow Stop
Beta: R over L Backward Crossovers, L over R Backward Crossovers, Right T-Stop
Gamma: RFI Mohawk Combo, LFI Mohawk Combo, Hockey Stop
Delta: RFI 3 -turn, LFI 3-turn, Bunny Hop
Freestyle 1: Forward Spiral, $1 / 2$ Flip, Two-Foot Spin
Freestyle 2: One-Half Lutz, One-Foot Spin, Dance Step
Freestyle 3: Salchow, Change Foot Spin, Back Pivot
Freestyle 4: Flip, Sit Spin, One-Half Loop
Freestyle 5-10 will use full ice surface.
Freestyle 5: Lutz, Axel, Camel-Sit-Upright Spin
Freestyle 6: Double Salchow, Split Falling Leaf, Layback or Sit-Change-Sit
Freestyle 7: Double Toe Loop or Double Toe Walley, Flying Camel, Two Walleys in sequence
Freestyle 8: Double Loop, Split Lutz, Flying Sit Spin or Axel Sit
Freestyle 9: Double Lutz, Axel-Double Loop Combination, Flying Camel into Jump Sit Spin
Freestyle 10: Death Drop, Double Axel-Double Toe Loop Combination, Triple Edge Jump of the
skater's choice

## SOLO SPOTLIGHT

Skaters may choose to enter one or more of the following categories, but different programs must be performed.

- Character - the skater portrays a famous, easily recognizable character.
- Light Entertainment - the skater performs a light-hearted, vaudeville type program using music, dance and skating moves.
- Dramatic - an artistic theatrical performance to create a mood that is enhanced by the style, creativity, costume and props (optional). The overall impression at the conclusion of the performance should be that it was a dramatic performance, not lighthearted as the light entertainment category.

## THEMED SOLO SPOTLIGHT (All Levels)

These events will use the same guidelines as for regular Couples Spotlight, Production teams \& Solo Spotlight events regarding levels, maneuver limitations, duration, and costume/prop restrictions. All programs in this event category must be related to this national event theme set for the current year.

The theme chosen is: "Magic"

## FOOTWORK (Bronze - Platinum)

Footwork is an event, in which the skaters perform a program to music consisting of original footwork sequences. Footwork programs must be different from the required dance step sequences for Freestyle levels 1-10. Skaters must have passed Freestyle 1 or Dance 1 to compete in Footwork events. Skaters must perform at the highest test level of Dance or Freestyle. One-half rotation jumps and spins less than three revolutions are permitted. Note: One-Half Loop Jump is a full rotation jump and is not acceptable, but a One-Half Loop Stop is now listed as an uncaptured move and must land and stop on both toe picks without gliding on the landing. Duration: 1 minute

## ARTISTIC SKATING

There are no required maneuvers in Artistic Skating, but there are maneuver limitations. Emphasis should be placed on the creative and innovative design of a skating program. Strong edges, body positions, flow, music interpretation, rhythm, choreography and artistry should be the main focus. Props are not allowed. A costume becomes a prop when it is detached or when it is detached using the hands. There is no grade for technical merit.

## INTERPRETIVE

In this event, the skater interprets a piece of music, which is heard for the first time just prior to the event. Handheld props are not allowed. *Skaters are not allowed to receive communication from instructors, parents, friends, skaters or anyone else during this event.

## RHYTHMIC SKATING

This entertaining routine requires the use of a hand prop. The program should contain elements that employ the use of the prop throughout the program. The skater must maintain control of their prop at all times. Spotlight entrance and exit rules apply. Props will not be allowed on the warm-up.

## Skaters must choose only one of the following props:

- Hoop - Wood or plastic. It must be rigid, non-bending material. Hoop can have colored tape or fabric, but cannot have any other decoration (i.e. fringe, etc.) on the prop. The diameter must be 2'7" - 2'11".
- Ball - Rubber or plastic - Diameter $73 / 4$ "
- Ribbon - Ribbon stick must be made of wood, plastic, or fiberglass and be 20 " - 30 " long. Ribbon must be one single streamer piece. Ribbon material must be satin or a non-starched fabric and be 2 " -4 " wide and 6 - 9 feet long.

## INDIVIDUAL HOCKEY EVENTS

## HOCKEY GOALIE

After a short warm-up, a designated shooter will attempt 10 shots on each goalie; five will be of the slap shot variety taken from inside the blue line, and five will be of the one-on-one variety where the shooter picks up the puck on the blue line and skates in on the goalie from any direction in an attempt to score. If the goalie catches or smothers the puck, play will stop. If a rebound comes out in front of the goad line, it is still playable and the shooter can take another shot. Goalies will be awarded one point for each save. No rebounds will be permitted on slap shots.

If a goalie is "against the book" with no other competitors in their age group, they must stop $80 \%-$ or 8 out of the 10 shots - to receive 1st Place. For less than 8 saves, the goalie will receive 2nd Place.

## HOCKEY SHOOTING

The skater will carry the puck on the stick while skating from one end of the rink to the other around a 4-cone course and will then skate toward the net and take a shot on goal. This is a timed event and the time will stop when the puck enters the net. The skater can shoot anytime after the 4th cone, but if they miss, they must get the puck and get it into the goal to stop the timing. The skater with the fastest time in that event group wins.

## HOCKEY SKATING

Skaters will race one or two at a time skating one forward lap around the rink carrying the puck on the stick. After completing the forward lap, the skater will drop the puck, keep the stick and skate another lap around the rink backwards. The skater with the fastest time in that event group wins. There will be a short warm-up for each hockey event.

## PARTNER AND TEAM EVENTS

## COUPLES SPOTLIGHT

(One team entry form should be filled out per team)
Two skaters together perform a routine that is entertaining, emotional or portrayal of characters using costumes and props (optional). Uncaptured pair or adagio style lifts and any overhead carry lifts are only allowed at Couples Spotlight High. This event is divided into low, medium, intermediate and high for partner selections. Groups will be divided as registration warrants.

## FAMILY SPOTLIGHT

(One team entry form should be filled out per team)
Two or more related family members only, of any age and ability, perform an entertainment based program. Costumes and props are encouraged to help illustrate the act. All participants must wear skates. There are no required elements and no technical score. Any skating maneuvers may be performed. Program length is $1: 30$ minutes.

## ENSEMBLE TEAM

This event is open to groups of 3-7 skaters of all levels and ages. Skaters will be judged on the entertainment and performance value of the program. Elaborate costumes and props are encouraged to enhance the performance. There are no required maneuvers and no technical score, but any skating maneuvers can be performed at any level.

## JUMP \& SPIN TEAM

A jump and spin team consists of any two skaters competing in the same category level, but they do not have to be at the same test level. Category entered must be the higher of the two skaters test levels. Only the technical accuracy of the maneuver is scored, not the difficulty level of the maneuver.

## Skater 2

Additional maneuvers or choreography are not allowed. Only the required maneuvers are judged. The skater may use only preparation or set-up steps. No music is required. Jumps must be skated first, spins second. All levels will use full ice.

## TEAM COMPULSORY FREESTYLE 1 - 10

Skaters are not permitted to skate below their test level registered at the ISI National Office. Any skater may skate over her/his level (i.e. a Freestyle 3 skater may skate on a Freestyle 5 team, but may not skate on a Freestyle 2 team). Individual skaters may participate on more than one team as long as they are not on two teams at the same freestyle level. The team must perform their program to music with all required maneuvers performed in order, as listed in the ISI Handbook. When choreographing a Team Compulsory routine, make sure each skater performing his/her required maneuver is highlighted and easily seen by the judges.
Coaches should fill out the team entry form. Duration: 3 minutes, 30 seconds

## PRODUCTION TEAM

This category is for your entire skating team. Skaters of all ages and ability levels can participate. Production teams consist of 8-25 skaters. Performance should be a lavish creative, artistic work marked by extreme freedom of style and structure, using costumes and props to illustrate the number. All types of skating maneuvers are accepted. All members must wear skates.

## THEATER PRODUCTION

This new production event is for your entire skating team. Skaters of all ages and advanced ability levels can participate in this theatrical team event. This is a creative and artistic program usually based on a story or theme, using costumes, props and technical skating to enhance the production performance.

## TEAM SURPRISE (All Levels)

This is a new "team" version of Surprise events. Each team must have 4 skaters from the same category level (listed below). Each skater may only participate on one team. Skaters under 6 years are not permitted to compete in Team Surprise events. Teams can be made up of all males, all females, or any combination - as long as the resulting test level category is the same for ALL TEAM MEMBERS. Entries will be divided into competition groups based on the average age and/or test levels of all 4 team members.

## Category Levels:

Low ALL team skaters must be in Pre-Alpha to Delta levels only.
Medium ALL team skaters must be in Freestyle 1-3 / Bronze levels \& below.
Intermediate ALL team skaters must be in Freestyle 4-5 / Silver levels \& below.
High ALL team skaters must be in Freestyle 6-10 / Gold / Platinum levels \& below.
Skaters may skate in a higher team category than their current test level - but not in a lower team category. If entries
are received with a team of skaters from different category levels, the team will be entered into the level of the highest skater. These team "surprises" will be a relay-type event where every member of the team must complete a required task. Some events might be related to skating ability - and some may not.

## TEAM COACHES AND SKATERS

Please keep in mind for all teams - if you have skaters on multiple teams within the same events category (ie: ensemble, production, theater) we will do our best to split groups when possible depending on the number of entries received - but cannot guarantee this. This may result in very quick changes for those skaters between team events.
